Master Seminar Business Taxation - WT 2025/26

- Corporate Taxation and Strategic Business Decisions -

I. Topics

The research seminar on Business Taxation is offered for **master students** only. There are no specific requirements to participate in this seminar. However, we recommend having basic knowledge in business taxation and statistics.

Corporate taxation plays a crucial role in shaping firms' strategic decisions regarding financing, investment, and sustainability. Recent research emphasizes not only the determinants of corporate tax burdens, but also how taxation interacts with key business areas such as leverage, R&D activities, and environmental strategies. Empirical evidence on these interrelations provides valuable insights for policymakers, as it helps assess the effectiveness of fiscal instruments and design tax policies that align with corporate decision-making. The seminar gives master students the opportunity to get a deeper understanding of empirical research methods. All participants have to write their own seminar paper about one of the following topics:

- Carbon Emissions and Corporate Tax Burden: An Empirical Analysis of Effective Tax Rates
- 2. R&D Tax Incentives and Innovation Intensity: Do Higher Tax Rates Drive Research Investments?
- 3. Leverage and Tax Shield Effects: The Relationship Between Debt Financing and Corporate Taxation
- 4. Renewable Energy and Corporate Profitability: Evidence on the Link Between Sustainability and Operating Margins
- 5. Carbon Intensity and R&D Investment: A Trade-Off Analysis of Environmental and Innovation Strategies

II. Objectives

The seminar enables participants to gain knowledge in empirical tax research. Students learn how to investigate associations between different variables using programming language (R or STATA can be used). Moreover, participants will learn how to write academic research projects and will get the opportunity to present their own research results.

III. Schedule

During the introductory session on October 13^{th} 2025 (2-4 pm) students will be informed about their topic and general questions will be answered. The colloquium is offered to teach participants basic statistical programming knowledge (i.e., usage of databases, introduction into R, descriptive statistics, regression analyses, etc.) and will take place in October and November (20^{th} (10-12 am), 27^{th} October (10 am -2 pm), 3^{rd} November (10 am -2 pm)). Attendance to the colloquium is optional, but strongly recommended. Additionally, all participants will receive an introduction to academic writing (i.e., paper style) on October 20^{th} 2025 (10-12 am).

Students have to submit an exposé of 2 pages until the 17th November 2025, 10 am via email (<u>taxation@uni-siegen.de</u>). The exposé must consist of the introduction, research question(s) and empirical methodology. Participants have the opportunity to receive feedback on their exposé and the planned regression on December 1st. Individual feedback sessions will be announced after registration.

Students have to submit their final seminar paper via email (to: <u>taxation@uni-siegen.de</u>) by no later than 19th December 2025, 10 am. Presentation of their work will take place on the 21st January 2026, 28th January 2026, 2nd February 2026 and/or 4th February 2026 (10 am – 6 pm). The exact time will be announced. The schedule for these days depends on the number of participants and will be announced after the registration period. It is likely that not all days will be needed. Attendance is mandatory on these days. PowerPoint and PDF files have to be submitted on or before 19th January 2026, 10 am via email (to: <u>taxation@uni-siegen.de</u>).

IV. Requirements on seminar paper and presentation

The seminar paper must not exceed **5,000 words** and should follow the "Guidelines of academic writ-

ing published by the Chair of Business Taxation". The language of the whole seminar is **English**. Thus,

students must write and present their work in English.

All students have to **present** the seminar paper on their own. The presentation should not be longer

than 15 minutes (+/- 10%). Afterwards, each paper will be discussed by all participants.

V. Grading

The final seminar grade consists of the following weighted performances: 10% exposé, 50% paper, 20%

presentation, 20% discussion. Grading is based on each participant separately. The exposé and the

seminar paper has to be graded with at least 4.0 to pass the seminar.

VI. Registration

The application and allocation to the seminar is organized in Unisono. Please find further information

on the homepage of the examination office (https://pafak3.wiwi.uni-siegen.de/info/prue-

<u>fungen/seminare/</u>). Topics will be allocated by the Chair of Business Taxation and can be assigned mul-

tiple times (if necessary). Topics will be announced in the introductory session. Please be aware that you cannot resign from the seminar once you have applied. If participants applied and do not attend

the seminar, the seminar will be graded with 5,0 (not passed).
